

## **Daily Louisiana Situation Report 5 - Hurricane Delta (10 Oct 2020)**

### **SUMMARY**

**Delta made landfall as a category 2 hurricane at approximately 6:00 PM local time on Friday, October 9, near Creole, Louisiana**

### **DISCUSSION AND OUTLOOK**

**At 400 PM CDT (2100 UTC), the center of Post-Tropical Cyclone Delta was located near latitude 33.7 North, longitude 90.0 West. The post-tropical cyclone is moving toward the northeast near 12 mph (19 km/h) and this motion is expected to become more east-northeasterly on Sunday.**

**Maximum sustained winds are near 30 mph (45 km/h) with higher gusts. Weakening is forecast during the next 36 hours, and Delta's surface low is expected to dissipate across West Virginia late Sunday night.**

**The estimated minimum central pressure is 998 mb (29.47 inches).**

### **POWER OUTAGES**

**As of 7:30 AM EDT, October 10, there are 878,974 outages across Louisiana, Mississippi, Texas due to Hurricane Delta.**
